6. Enabling digital health solutions

To make healthcare more accessible, affordable, and scalable by enabling digital health solutions Americas RISE for Health participants welcomes multisectoral efforts to:

- Clarify and harmonize definitions and nomenclature within countries to enable digital health adoption;
- Develop appropriate policies to protect personal health data, while removing unnecessary barriers to cross border data transfers, and spur product development and other forms of innovation:
- Encourage measures that enable the use of digital health solutions at every step of the patient journey; and
- Exchange best practices for the development of basic infrastructure needs for digital health (e.g., electricity and internet coverage), especially for those communities with limited access.

RISE Governance



	To facilitate advancement of pillar workstreams in the RISE statement, and to provide inputs into future RISE statements, the U.S. Department of Commerce proposes the establishment of: 1. A Steering Group Committee comprised of representatives from interested governments, international organizations, the Americas Business Dialogue, and REDLAD, that meets once a year to develop RISE terms of reference, develop RISE agendas, and draft RISE statements. Committee members to include one representative per each stakeholder group, e.g., one representative per country, one representative from the Joint Summit Working Group, one representative from the ABD, one representative from REDLAD. The United States offers to chair for the 2023 calendar year through the end of the Second Americas RISE for Health (RISE II).
	2. Six pillar workstreams (Trade and Investment; Regulatory Improvements; Health Investments; Ethics; Equity and Inclusivity; and Digital Health) each led by two government co-chairs and comprised of interested government, private sector, and civil society stakeholders that meet at least twice a year.
	The United States proposes that Steering Group and Pillar Workstream nominations for new members and co-chairs occur every year in preparation for each annual RISE meeting.
